INTRODUCTION

The Schneider Electric Smart-UPS[™] RT is a high performance, uninterruptible power supply (UPS) that provides protection for electronic equipment from utility power blackouts, brownouts, sags and surges. The UPS filters small utility line fluctuations and isolates electronic equipment from large disturbances by internally disconnecting from utility line power. The UPS provides continuous power from the internal battery until utility power returns to safe levels or the battery is fully discharged.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

Read the instructions carefully to become familiar with the equipment before trying to install, operate, service or maintain it. The following special messages may appear throughout this manual or on the equipment to warn of potential hazards or to call attention to information that clarifies or simplifies a procedure.

Changes and modifications to the UPS not expressly approved by APC could void the warranty.

- Adhere to all national and local electrical codes.
- All wiring must be performed by a qualified electrician.
- This UPS is intended for indoor use only.
- Be sure the air vents on the UPS are not blocked. Allow adequate space for proper ventilation.
- The battery typically lasts for two to five years. Environmental factors impact battery life. Elevated ambient temperatures, poor quality utility power, and frequent short duration discharges will shorten battery life.
- The batteries are heavy. Remove the batteries prior to installing the UPS in a rack.
- The model and serial numbers are located on a small, rear panel label. For some models, an additional label is located on the chassis under the front bezel.
- Always recycle used batteries.
- Recycle the package materials or save them for reuse.

Deenergizing

The UPS contains internal batteries and may present a shock hazard even when disconnected from the branch circuit (mains). Before installing or servicing the equipment, check that the system enable switch is set to stand by (off), the internal batteries are removed, the external extended run batteries are disconnected and the branch circuit (main) is disconnected.

DAMAGE TO EQUIPMENT OR PERSONNEL

- Adhere to all national and local electrical codes.
- Wiring must be performed by a qualified electrician.
- Before installing or replacing the batteries, remove jewelry such as wristwatches and rings. High short circuit current through conductive materials could cause severe burns.

Electrical Safety

- The protective earth conductor for the UPS carries the leakage current from the load devices. An insulated ground conductor is to be installed as part of the branch circuit that supplies the UPS. The conductor must have the same size and insulation material as the grounded and ungrounded branch circuit supply conductors. The conductor will be green and with or without a yellow stripe.
- The grounding conductor is to be grounded to earth at the service equipment, or if supplied by a separately derived system, at the supply transformer or motor generator set.

Battery Safety

- Do not dispose of batteries in a fire. The batteries may explode.
- Do not open or mutilate batteries. Released electrolyte is harmful to the skin and eyes, and may be toxic

Hardwire Safety

- Verify that all branch circuit (mains) and low voltage (control) circuits are deenergized, and locked out before installing cables or making connections, whether in the junction box or to the UPS.
- Strain relief is required for all hardwiring.
- All openings allowing access to UPS hardwiring terminals must be covered. Failure to do so may result in
 personal injury or equipment damage.
- Select wire size and connectors according to national and local codes.
- Ensure that the total load DOES NOT EXCEED the branch circuit breaker.
- Use flexible metal conduit to make maintenance and service easier.






INPUT HARDWIRE INSTALLATION





OUTPUT HARDWIRE INSTALLATION





Connect Equipment and Power to the UPS

- 1. Connect equipment to the UPS.
- 2. To use the UPS as a master ON/OFF switch, be sure all connected equipment is switched ON. The equipment will not turn on until the UPS is turned on.
- 3. To turn on the UPS press the button on the front panel.
 - The UPS battery charges when it is connected to utility power.
 - The battery charges to 90% capacity during the first three hours of normal operation. *Do not* expect full battery run time capability during this initial charge period.



OPERATION

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Indicator	Description
Online Ay	The Online LED illuminates when the UPS is drawing utility power and performing double conversion to supply power to connected equipment.
On Battery	The UPS is supplying battery power to the connected equipment.
Bypass	The Bypass LED illuminates indicating that the UPS is in bypass mode. Utility power is sent directly to connected equipment during bypass mode operation. Bypass mode operation is the result of an internal UPS fault, an overload condition or a user initiated command either through an accessory or the manual bypass switch. Battery operation is not available while the UPS is in bypass mode. Refer to <i>Troubleshooting</i> in this manual.
Fault X	The UPS detects an internal fault. Refer to <i>Troubleshooting</i> in this manual.
Overload	An overload condition exists. See <i>Troubleshooting</i> .
Replace Battery	The battery is disconnected or must be replaced. See <i>Troubleshooting</i> .

On Battery Operation

The UPS switches to battery operation automatically if the utility power fails. While running on battery, an alarm beeps four times every 30 seconds.

Press the (Test) button to silence this alarm. If the utility power does not return, the UPS continues to supply power to the connected equipment until the battery is fully discharged.

When 2 minutes of run time remain the UPS emits a continuous beeping. If PowerChute is not being used, files must be manually saved and the computer must be turned off before the UPS fully discharges the battery.

The UPS battery life differs based on usage and environment. Refer to the APC by Schneider Electric Web site, <u>www.apc.com</u> for on battery runtimes.



CONNECT THE EMERGENCY POWER OFF OPTION

The output power can be disabled in an emergency by closing a switch connected to the emergency power off (EPO) button.



The EPO switch is internally powered by the UPS for use with non-powered switch circuit breakers.

The EPO circuit is considered a Class 2 circuit, (UL, CSA standards) and a SELV circuit (IEC standard).

Both Class 2 and SELV circuits must be isolated from all primary circuitry. Do not connect any circuit to the EPO terminal block unless it can be confirmed that the circuit is Class 2 or SELV.

If circuit standard cannot be confirmed, use a contact closure switch.

Use one of the following cable types to connect the UPS to the EPO switch:

- CL2: Class 2 cable for general use
- CL2P: Plenum cable for use in ducts, plenums, and other spaces used for environmental air.
- CL2R: Riser cable for use in a vertical run in a floor to floor shaft.
- CLEX: Limited use cable for use in dwellings and for use in raceways.

Terminal Mode to Configure UPS Parameters

Terminal Mode is a menu driven interface that enables enhanced configuration of the UPS.

Connect the serial cable (supplied), to the serial com connector on the back of the UPS.

If PowerChute Business Edition is not installed do not perform steps 1or 1a. Go directly to step 2 in these instructions.

- 1. For Windows users: STOP the PowerChute *Server* using the following steps:
 - From the Desktop, go to Start => Settings => Control Panel => Administrative Tools => Services.
 - Select APC PowerChute Server right click the mouse and select Stop.
- 1a. For Linux users: STOP the PowerChute Server using the following steps:
 - Change directory to /etc/init.d.
 - Initiate the command ./PowerChute stop.
- 2. Open a terminal program. Example: HyperTerminal
 - From the Desktop, go to Start => Programs => Accessories => Communication => HyperTerminal.
- 3. Double-click on the HyperTerminal icon.
 - Follow the prompts to choose a name and select an icon. Disregard the message, "...must install a modem," if it is displayed. Click OK.
 - Select the COM port that is connected to your UPS. The port settings are:
 - ✓ bits per second 9600
 - ✓ data bits 8
 - ✓ parity none
 - ✓ stop bit 1
 - ✓ flow control none
 - Press ENTER
- 4. Press 1 to modify the UPS parameters.
- 5. Follow the prompts.
- 6. Exit the terminal program.

MAINTENANCE

This UPS has an easy to replace, hot swappable battery module. Replacement is a safe procedure, isolated from electrical hazards. You may leave the UPS and connected equipment on during the procedure.

CAUTION

DAMAGE TO EQUIPMENT

- Once the batteries are disconnected, the devices connected to the UPS are no longer protected from power surges and outages.
- Replace internal and external battery modules with APC approved replacement battery modules. Go to the APC by Schneider Electric Web site, <u>www.apc.com</u> for information on replacement battery modules for your UPS and external battery packs.




Shut down and disconnect any equipment attached to the UPS.

Schneider Electric IT Corporation (SEIT), warrants its products to be free from defects in materials and workmanship for a period of two (2) years from the date of purchase. The SEIT obligation under this warranty is limited to repairing or replacing, at its own sole option, any such defective products. Repair or replacement of a defective product or parts thereof does not extend the original warranty period.

This warranty applies only to the original purchaser who must have properly registered the product within 10 days of purchase. Products may be registered online at warranty.apc.com.

SEIT shall not be liable under the warranty if its testing and examination disclose that the alleged defect in the product does not exist or was caused by end user's or any third person's misuse, negligence, improper installation, testing, operation or use of the product contrary to SEIT's recommendations or specifications. Further, SEIT shall not be liable for defects resulting from: 1) unauthorized attempts to repair or modify the product, 2) incorrect or inadequate electrical voltage or connection, 3) inappropriate on site operation conditions, 4) Acts of God, 5) exposure to the elements, or 6) theft. In no event shall SEIT have any liability under this warranty for any product where the serial number has been altered, defaced, or removed.

Service

If the unit requires service, do not return it to the dealer. Follow these steps:

- 1. Review the *Troubleshooting* section of the manual to eliminate common problems.
- 2. If the problem persists, contact APC by Schneider Electric Customer Support through the APC by Schneider Electric Web site, **www.apc.com**.
 - a. Note the model number and serial number and the date of purchase. The model and serial numbers are located on the rear panel of the unit and are available through the LCD display on select models.
 - b. Call APC by Schneider Electric Customer Support and a technician will attempt to solve the problem over the phone. If this is not possible, the technician will issue a Returned Material Authorization Number (RMA#).
 - c. If the unit is under warranty, the repairs are free.
 - d. Service procedures and returns may vary internationally. Refer to the APC by Schneider Electric Web site for country specific instructions.
- 3. Pack the unit in the original packaging whenever possible to avoid damage in transit. Never use foam beads for packaging. Damage sustained in transit is not covered under warranty.
 - a. Always DISCONNECT THE UPS BATTERIES before shipping. The United States Department of Transportation (DOT), and the International Air Transport Association (IATA) regulations require that UPS batteries be disconnected before shipping. The internal batteries may remain in the UPS.
 - b. External Battery Pack products are deenergized when disconnected from the associated UPS product. It is not necessary to disconnect the internal batteries for shipping. Not all units utilize an external battery pack.
- 4. Write the RMA# provided by Customer Support on the outside of the package.
- 5. Return the unit by insured, prepaid carrier to the address provided by Customer Support.

Transport

- 1. Shut down and disconnect all connected equipment.
- 2. Disconnect the unit from utility power.
- 3. Disconnect all internal and external batteries (if applicable).
- 4. Follow the shipping instructions outlined in the Service section of this manual.
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
